Arrival in Budapest

The Budapest Liszt Ferenc International Airport is located approximately 25 km from the city centre.

Means of transportation from the airport Taxi

Főtaxi is the official taxi company of Liszt Ferenc International Airport. They have a stand at both terminals (2A and 2B). The company operates at a fixed tariff of 440 HUF/Km (1.15 EUR/Km) in addition to the one-off basic fee of 1100 HUF (2.85 EUR) and waiting fee. At the taxi stands you can find a map showing tariffs. The estimated travel time is 40 minutes, depending on traffic.

miniBUD

MiniBUD is the official airport shuttle service provider for Budapest Airport. It is a kind of collective taxi with a boarding capacity of 8 to 10 passengers. The mini buses handle transfers between the airport to the passenger's accommodation. The service is available 24/7. MiniBUD airport shuttle service desks can be found at both terminals. Tickets can be purchased at the arrival customs area or at the LRI Airport Passenger Service desk in the waiting area.

You can pay by cash or credit card at the desks. You can order your minibus online too. The transfer from the airport to the major hotels takes approximately 1 hour depending on traffic.

Public transport

Tickets can be purchased directly from the bus driver (by cash) or at the Customer Service Points of BKK Centre for Budapest Transport at the airport's Terminals (by cash or card) or via BudapestGO application. For longer stays BKK offers more convenient travelcards for visitors (24, 48 or 72-hour travel passes).

Please note that tickets are have to be validated (paper tickets have to be stamped or punched):

- prior to the start of travel on metro lines M1, M2, M3 and M4 upon entering the station,
- immediately after boarding on other vehicles inside the vehicle.

■ **How to get to the Museum and Library of Hungarian Agriculture**

The Museum and Library of Hungarian Agriculture is located in the Vajdahunyad Castle at the City Park (Address: Budapest, Vajdahunyad sétány, 1146).

Arriving from the Liszt Ferenc Airport 2:

Take bus 100E to reach Deák Ferenc square. On Deák Ferenc Square take the underground metro line 1 (M1 yellow) towards Mexikói út. Travel for 8 stops and get off the train on the Széchenyi fürdő/Széchenyi bath stop. Your destination can be reached from here by walk (duration approx. 6 minutes). Take the stairs: exit via Széchenyi fürdő (» Mexikói út), head west, turn left toward Kós Károly stny. Take the stairs again, turn right onto Kós Károly sétány, turn left toward Winston Churchill sétány, turn right onto Winston Churchill sétány, continue onto Vázsonyi Vilmos sétány, turn left onto Vajdahunyad sétány, destination will be on the right in Vajdahunyad Castle.

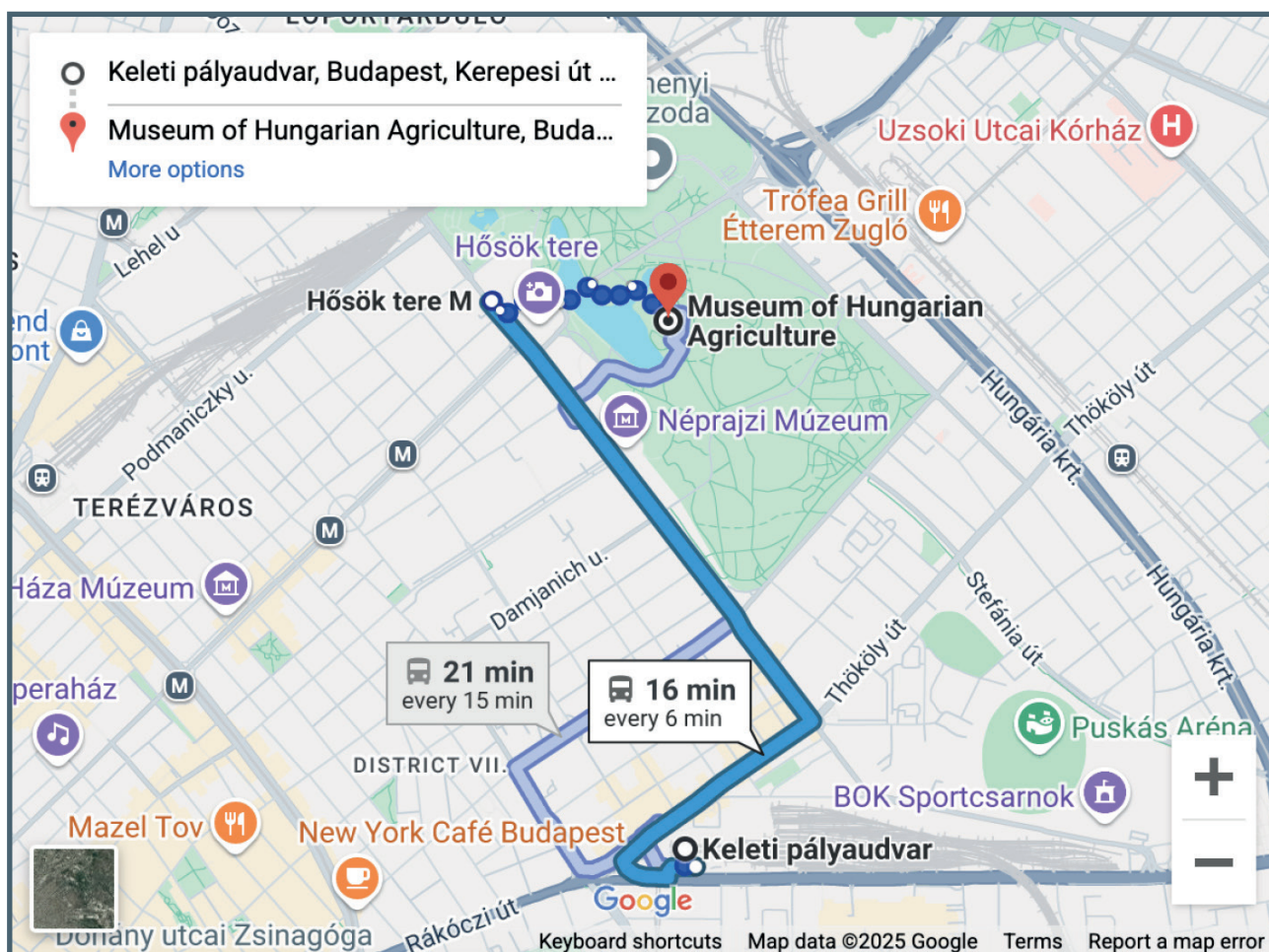
Arriving from the Keleti Train Station:

Head East for about 1 minute, look for the bus station. There are 3 bus options to reach the venue:

Option 1

Take bus 20E (direction to Káposztásmegyer, Szilas-patak) and travel for 6 minutes, 2 stops and get off at the Hősök tere M (Heroes Square M) stop. Your destination can be reached from here by walk (duration approx. 9 minutes). Head southeast on Dózsa György út then turn left onto Hősök tere. Take a slight left turn onto Kós Károly sétány, turn right to stay on Kós Károly sétány. Cross the road, continue to follow Kós Károly sétány. Turn right onto Vázsonyi Vilmos sétány then turn right onto Vajdahunyad stny. Destination will be on the right.

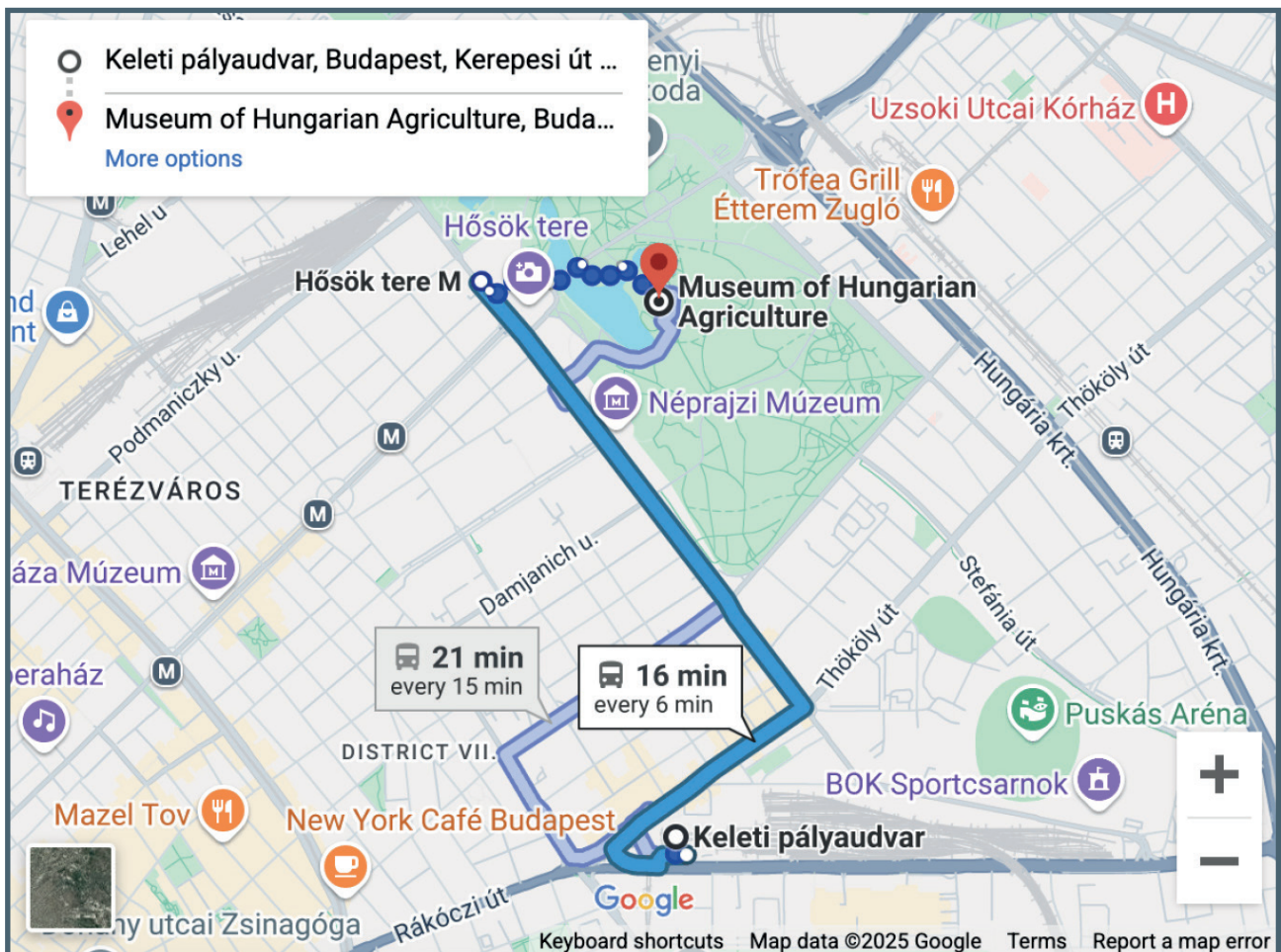

Option 2

Take bus 30 (direction to Káposztásmegyer, Mogyoródi-patak) and travel for 9 minutes, 6 stops, then get off the bus at the Benczúr utca stop. Your destination can be reached from here by walk (duration approx. 9 minutes). Head northwest on Dózsa György way toward Benczúr street/Verona angyalai street. Turn right onto Verona angyalai street then turn right onto George Washington sétány. Turn left toward Vajdahunyad sétány, turn right toward Vajdahunyad sétány, turn left onto Vajdahunyad sétány. Destination will be on the left.

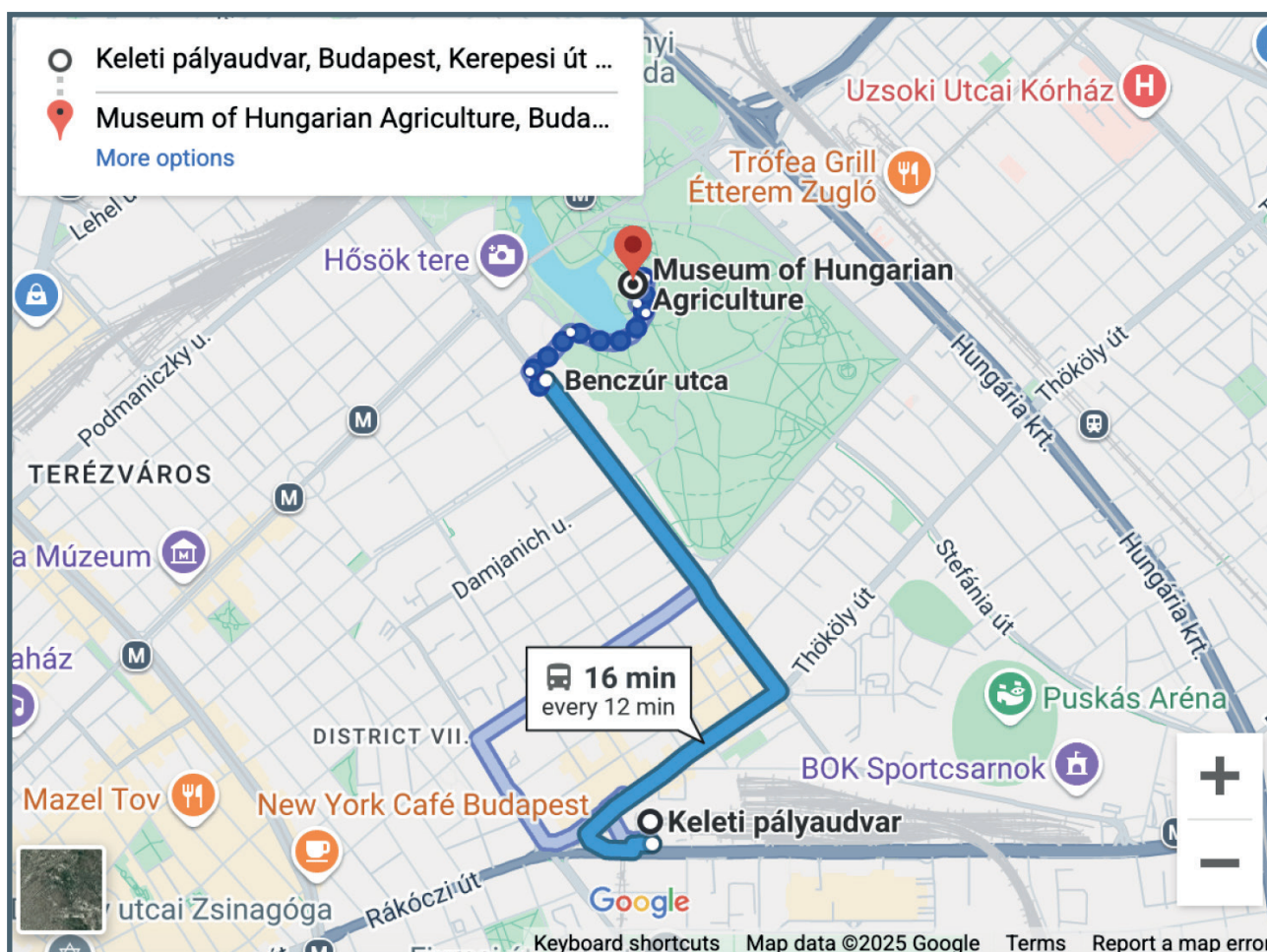

Option 3

Take bus 30A (direction to Megyer, Szondi utca). Travel for 7 minutes, 5 stops, then get off the bus at the Benczúr utca stop. Your destination can be reached from here by walk (duration approx. 9 minutes). Head northwest on Dózsa György út toward Benczúr treet/Verona angyalai street. Turn right onto Verona angyalai street, then turn right onto George Washington sétány. Turn left toward Vajdahunяд sétány. Turn right toward Vajdahunяд sétány. Turn left onto Vajdahunяд sétány. Destination will be on the left.

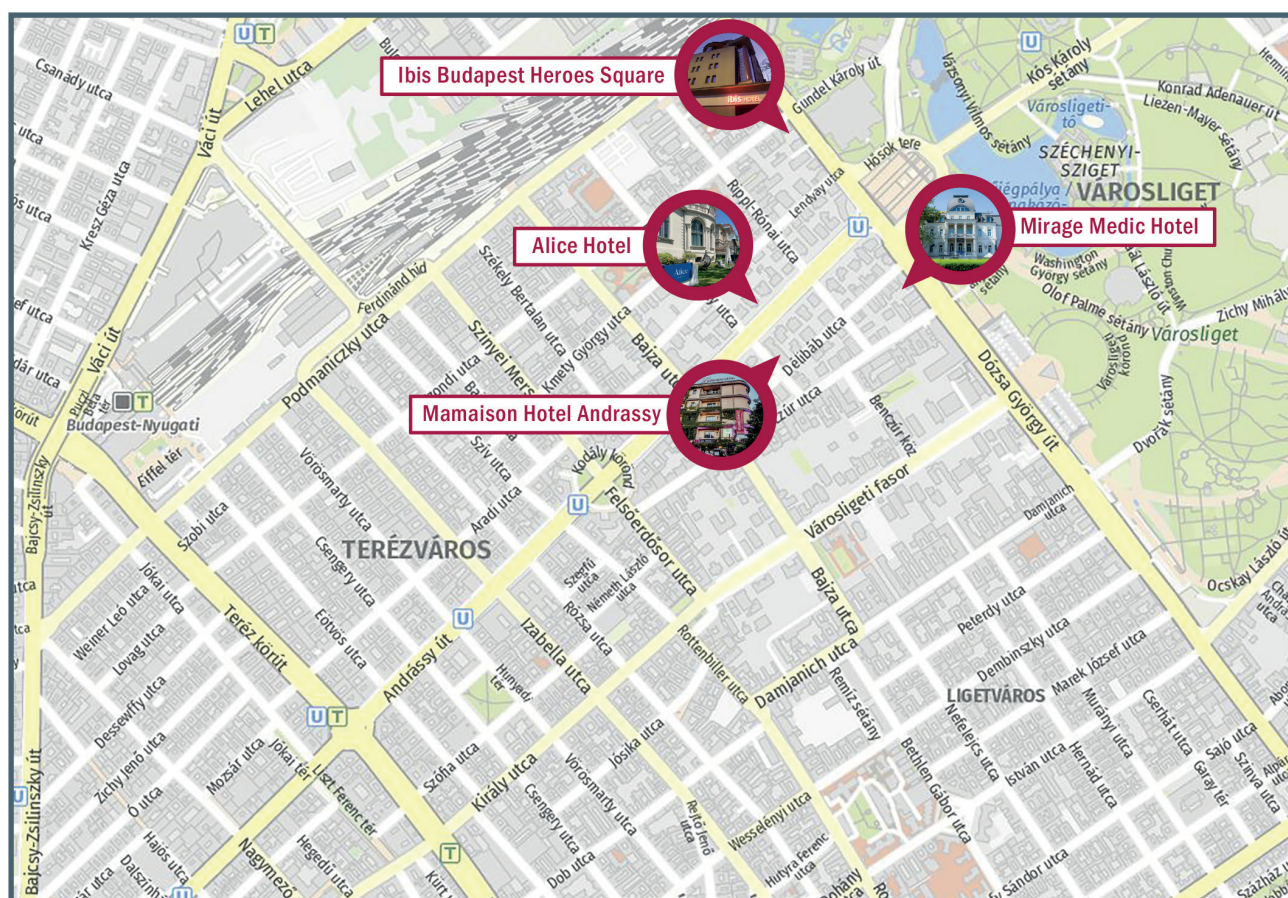


Map for metro and tram lines:

■ Time zone

Budapest is on Central European time: GMT+1, Daylight Saving Time (Apr-Oct): GMT+2

■ Money

The Hungarian currency is Forint (HUF, Ft) 1 EUR is = 400 HUF.

Credit cards

Major credit/debit cards can be used to get cash from ATMs in banks and on the streets as well as to pay bills in hotels, restaurants, taxi cars and shops.

Exchange

All visitors are advised to exchange currency only at accredited places. The majority of banks have 24-hour ATM's, some of them can also exchange foreign currency. Individual banks and travel agencies are free to set their own rates, but they must be clearly displayed. Rates offered at bureaux de change in the city centre and near the main railway stations are generally better than those available in the banks, at the airport or in the hotels.

■ Electricity

For Hungary there are two associated plug types, types C and F. Plug type C is the plug which has two round pins and plug type F is the plug which has two round prongs with two earth clips on the side. Hungary operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.

■ Budapest baths

Budapest, known as the "City of baths," boasts a rich history of thermal bathing culture, thanks to its location along the geological fault line of the Danube River. This unique position provides an abundance of natural thermal springs, which have been utilized for centuries. The city's thermal baths date back to Roman times, with significant development during the Turkish occupation, leaving a legacy of stunning Ottoman-era bathhouses. Today, Budapest's baths, such as the iconic Széchenyi, Gellért, and Rudas Baths, offer therapeutic waters rich in minerals, renowned for their health benefits, including relief from arthritis and joint pain. Visitors can immerse themselves in history while enjoying the healing properties of these legendary baths.

Széchenyi Thermal Bath

This Pest-side bath is one of the largest spa complexes in Europe. The bath's thermal water comes from a depth of 1250 meters and its temperature is approx. 77°C. The water in the thermal pools is reduced to 30-40°C with healing effect that can help in curing the disorders of joints of the hips and knees, chronic arthritis, rehabilitation after orthopaedic surgery and trauma – vertebral disease, chronic arthritis in inactive stages and neuralgic pain.

Rudas Thermal Bath

The bath was one of the first thermal baths of which centrepiece was built in the 16th century. The octagonal Turkish bath is used for therapeutic purposes and provides sauna facility since 1986. Not only bath treatments, but drinking therapy is also available in Rudas consuming the water of the springs Hungária, Attila and Juventus. Wellness enthusiasts can enjoy the traditional water massage, the Sky Terrace both during the day and at night.

Gellért Baths

The Gellért Baths, located in Budapest, is a renowned thermal bath complex celebrated for its Art Nouveau architecture and therapeutic waters. Established in 1918, the baths utilize mineral-rich thermal springs from Gellért Hill, known for their healing properties. The interior features stunning mosaics, stained glass windows, and elegant columns. Visitors can enjoy multiple indoor and outdoor pools, including a thermal pool, adventure pool, whirlpool, and the famous wave pool active during the summer months. The relaxing ambiance and luxurious facilities make it a must-visit destination.

Veli Bej Baths

The Veli Bej Baths, located in Budapest, is a historic thermal bath complex renowned for its Ottoman-era architecture and therapeutic waters.
